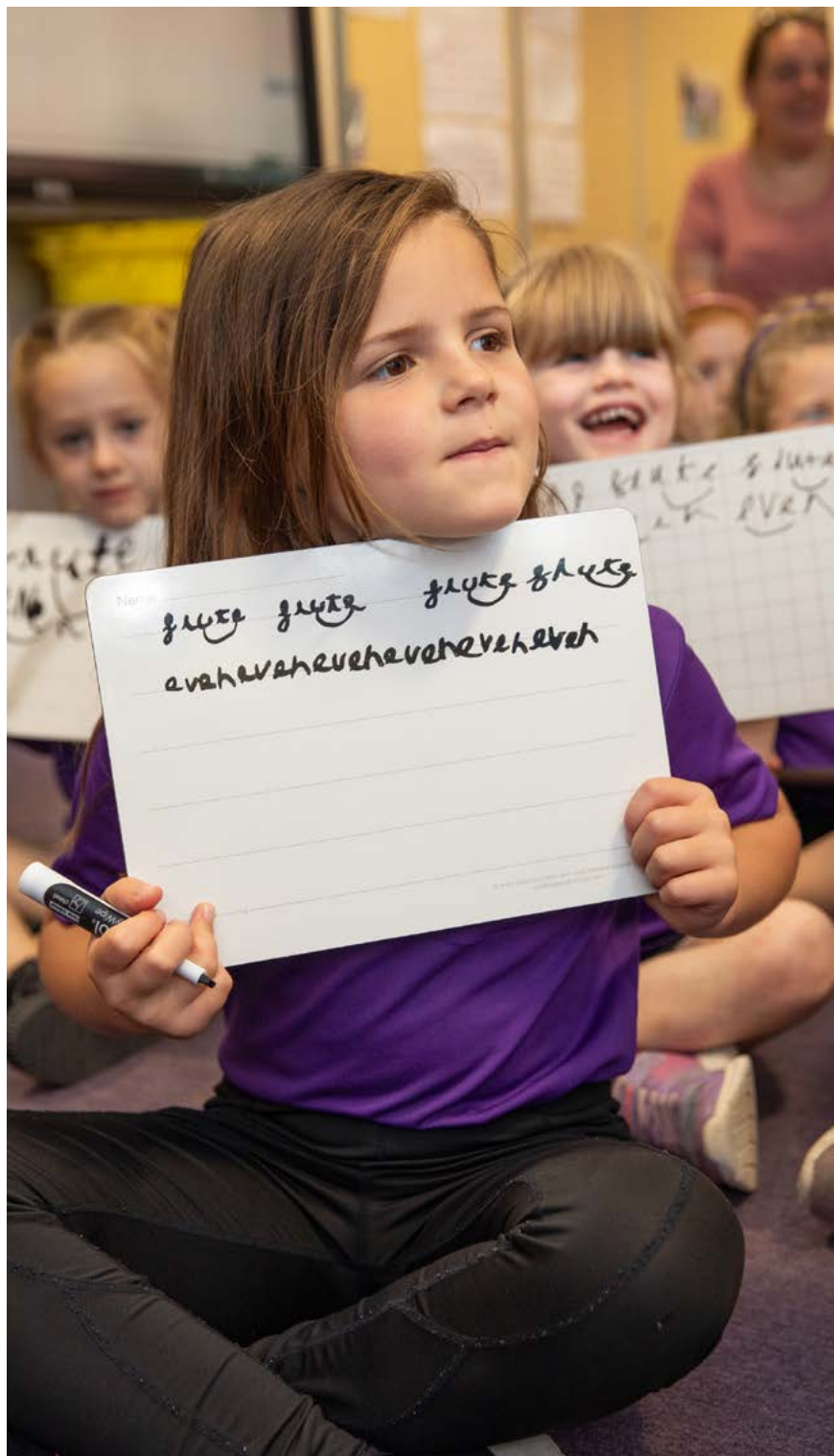

Our aim at Ashby Willesley is to nurture happy, well-rounded individuals who are equipped to achieve their full potential during their time with us and beyond.

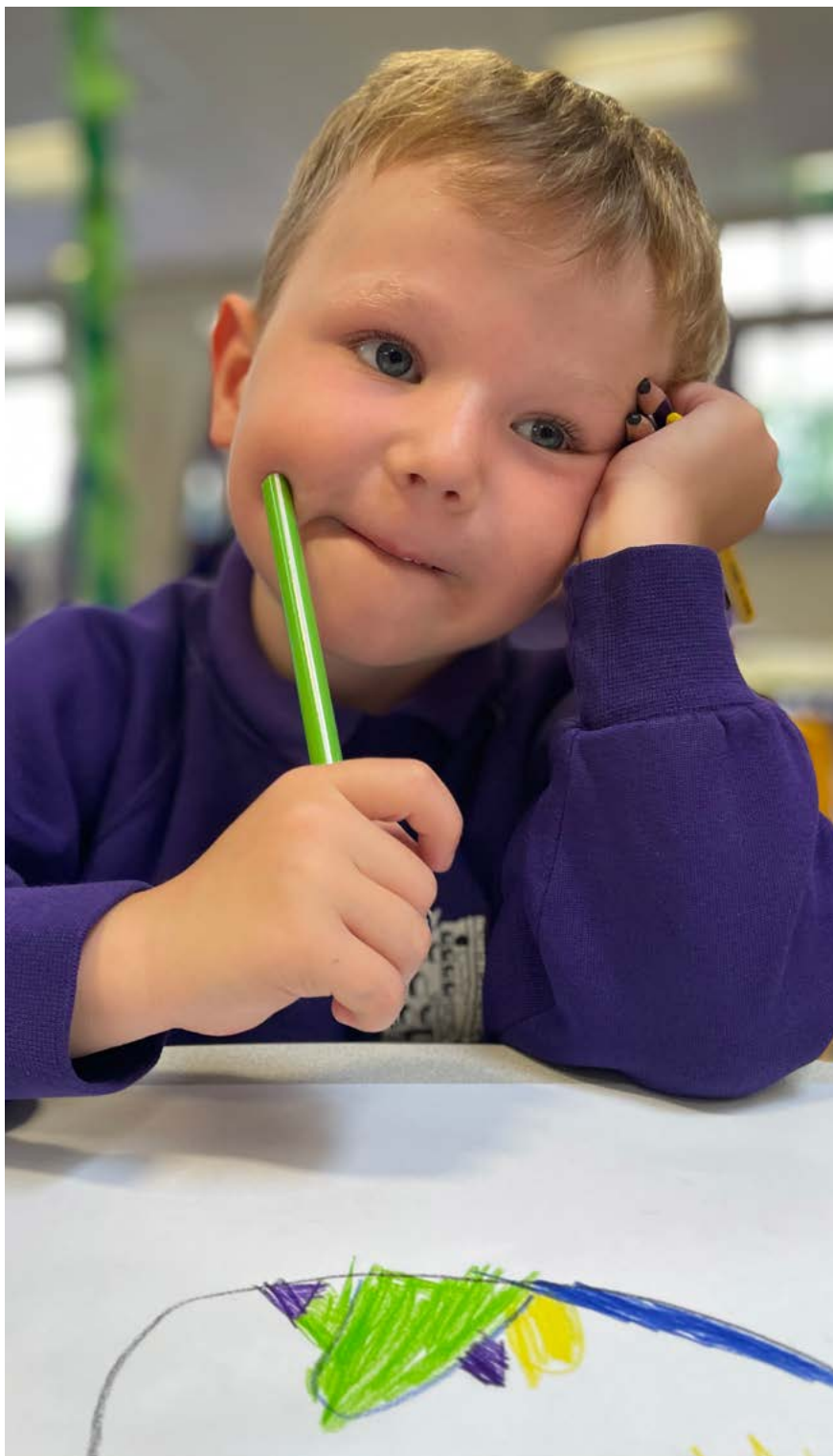
Our high expectations, challenging curriculum and positive ethos all contribute towards this.

Reading

We value the importance of reading and believe that this is the key to future success as it unlocks all other subjects.

Our reading philosophy is 'Learn to Read...Read to Learn'

In EYFS and KS1 we 'Learn to Read' through:

- ★ Daily teaching of systematic phonics using Sounds Write
- ★ Exposure to quality texts in all curriculum areas
- ★ Carefully matched reading books to phonics
- ★ Promoting a love of reading
- ★ Encouraging a strong partnership between home and school

In KS2 we 'Read to Learn' through:

- ★ Exposure to high quality texts in all curriculum areas
- ★ Shared and guided reading
- ★ Using reading skills to learn more about children's own interest
- ★ Adult modelling of reading



Enrichment

We value the importance of ensuring that pupils have the opportunity to learn through experiences that enhance and go beyond our curriculum. These enrichment opportunities enable children to use their imagination, challenge themselves and create memories. We have a consistent approach across the school; all pupils in every year group are offered the following enrichment opportunities throughout the year.

In addition to these, we offer year group specific enrichment throughout the year. Examples of what these may include:

Sport

We are extremely proud of our excellent reputation for sport. We have won Primary School of the Year at the NW Leicestershire Sports Awards on several occasions, in recognition of our excellent attendance and engagement in sporting events. Our PE curriculum offers two hours of quality provision ranging from the learning of throwing and catching skills to outdoor and adventurous pursuits. Through our PE curriculum, our pupils also learn about perseverance and resilience and the benefits that sport brings to their physical and

mental health. ME Sports coaches support our teaching and learning as well as offering a variety of high-quality sports clubs after school. We aim for every pupil to experience a sporting enrichment opportunity, each year.

What Makes Us Unique

School Grounds

Our unique location provides us with the best opportunity to explore what Ashby has to offer as well as benefitting from the wellbeing associated with the countryside.

We are fortunate to have a large outdoor space and newly appointed buildings, carefully designed to suit our pupils' learning and cognition. Year 6 have a dedicated, air-conditioned learning space in the tree tops building. We have a recently landscaped sensory garden overlooking the neighbouring fields, a dedicated outdoor play area for children in EYFS and a Garden of Dreams where children can use their imagination for play.

Music

We provide music lessons for a range of instruments, including piano, flute, clarinet, guitar, saxophone, and recorder. Our school has dedicated specialist tutors who conduct these lessons during the school day.

In Year 4, all pupils learn to play an instrument eg clarinet and our curriculum is challenging, engaging and offers plenty of opportunity to play instruments. Our school choir attends Young Voices on an annual basis and regularly performs at school events.

ELSA

At Willesley, we prioritise the mental health and wellbeing of our pupils and staff. We recognise that children of any age can experience wellbeing or mental health issues at any time and make it our aim to offer support as early as possible. We have a qualified Emotional Literacy Support Assistant (ELSA) and a dedicated wellbeing room to support our pupils. We also have a senior children's mental health lead.

SEND

We have an experienced SENDCO whose role is to ensure that pupils with SEND have access to appropriate and targeted provision, to enable them to reach their full potential. We draw extensively on the expertise and support of external services and work in close partnership with parents. Our school environment and curriculum are carefully planned, taking into consideration the needs of all pupils.

Our breakfast club is run by school staff and provides a calm and nurturing start to the school day. Children are provided with a healthy breakfast and a variety of activities to engage in.
